

ITF Multi-Purpose Cooperative Society Inducts New EXCOs

Following its recently concluded election, the Multi-Purpose Cooperative Society Limited (MCSL) of the Industrial Training Fund has sworn in their newly elected EXCOs.

The swearing in was conducted by Barr. Mambul Gwomwok, during the Annual General Meeting of the Cooperative at the ITF Headquarters, Jos.

Speaking at the meeting, the Director, Administration and Human Resource Department, Mr. Tajudeen Ishola, who was represented by the Chief Human Resource Officer, Mr. Malan Moltok, charged the new EXCOs to uphold honesty and transparency during their tenure as the ITF had been rated high by the Independent Corrupt Practices and Other Related Matters Commission (ICPC) in terms of transparency.

He encouraged them to carry along those that lost in the election in their tenure and welcome ideas that would make the Cooperative better.

In his address, the Executive Secretary, Plateau State Cooperative Federation (PSCF), Mr. Ayuba Azi said that Cooperatives are all about relationship and therefore, urged the new EXCOs to get the ITF Cooperative registered with the PSCF as the Apex Cooperative body in the state.

He added that there were benefits that accrued to registered Cooperatives in terms of gaining new ideas and support.

The previous President of the Cooperative who recently retired from the Fund, Mr. Ishaya Audu, thanked God for a successful election which he adjudged to be free and fair as no petition was written against the electoral committee.

He reeled out the achievements of his tenure, noting that the Cooperative had recorded 25% growth in Net Consolidated Fund, 26% in Surplus, 25% in Total Assets and a notable increase in membership.

While giving his acceptance speech, the new President of the MCSL, Engr. Ulla Henry, declared that his leadership would be anchored on transparency.

“Our promise is to bequeath to you a leadership anchored on transparency and accountability. So I encourage everyone in ITF to join the cooperative and urge existing members to remain, for the future always hold more promises than our past”, he said.

He added that his Management would need to take stock of the current status of the Cooperative by looking through the books and records so as to clearly chart a new course for the Cooperative.

While appreciating all Cooperators for the faith reposed in them, Mr Henry stated that the new EXCO would be maximally available to all Cooperators and open more channels of communication to ensure optimal accessibility.

He concluded that “We promise to remain true to our words and urge you to always tell us our mistakes but tell others our successes”.
