

“To Whom Much is Given, Much is Expected”, DG ITF Charges Staff

The Director-General of the Industrial Training Fund (ITF), Sir Joseph N. Ari, KSM, has charged ITF staff to work harder to increase the revenue base of the Fund as “to whom much is given, much is also expected”.

He said this while addressing staff of the Yenagoa Area Office, reminding them that his administration had three objectives which are “to work as unto God, restore the lost glory of ITF and hand over the organisation to God for help.”

He recounted the successes recorded in his 3-years leadership in the areas of special skills intervention programmes, automation of the Fund’s activities, projects embarked upon to boost staff welfare and several other achievements which needed to be built upon.

Ari stated that there had been great improvement in staff welfare under his administration which was aimed at getting the best out of the staff of the Fund for maximum productivity.

He, therefore, promised to look into all requests of the Area Office in the 2020 budget with the intention of approving among others the fencing of the Area Office land located at Opolo Elebele Road, Bayelsa, to avoid encroachment.

Earlier in her welcome remarks, the Area Manager, ITF Yenagoa A/O, Mrs. Loveth Sampson commended the DG’s visionary, committed and proactive leadership style which had revived and transformed the Fund, recording evident successes.

She outlined the achievements, constraints and prospects of the Area Office and requesting for funding to purchase equipment that would assist the Area Office in carrying out its assigned duties.

A member of the ITF Governing Council, Barrister Pere Peretus, lauded the Management of the Area Office and urged the DG and Management to make efforts to collaborate with the Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board (NCDMB) in order to improve training at the Fund.
