

INDUSTRIAL TRAINING FUND DONATES EDUCATIONAL ITEMS TO 2 SCHOOLS IN PLATEAU STATE.

The Director General of the Industrial Training Fund (ITF) Sir Joseph Ari has disclosed that the Fund has churned out deliberate policies to give impetus to the secondary school level of education just as it is passionate about learning facilities and conducive learning environment.

The Director General was speaking when he commissioned sets of computers, work stations, classroom desks and rehabilitated sick-bay at the Government Science School, Kuru and St. John Vianney Minor Seminary, Barkin Ladi, all in Plateau State, donated by the ITF.

He emphasized that without the variables of conducive environment and adequate learning facilities; there would be a crack in the foundation of grooming future leaders. According to the duo, the gesture shows that the ITF has interest of secondary school education at heart especially teaching of science and technology, they made promises to ensure Judicious and proper use of all facilities and equipment presented to them.

Earlier in a remark, the Director, Research and curriculum Development Department, Mr Zachariah Piwuna informed both schools that they were privileged to be chosen among the institutions in Plateau state. This he said became possible because many other institutions were pencilled down for the same project, but they became the lucky beneficiaries.
